I am going to the Void Gallery in Derry/ Londonderry. Void is an art gallery.

What does Void do? Void Gallery shows the artwork of established artists from all over the world. They also have a lot of workshops, talks, and events that help me understand and appreciate with the artwork in new ways.

Void Gallery is on the Strand Road on Waterloo Place.

An art gallery is a space to experience art. Art such as painting, sculpture, print, photography, video, performance, and installation. Every exhibition has different artists and art in it. Void Gallery has a new exhibition approximately every 8 weeks. But the duration can change. Sometimes the gallery has guided tours, performances, artist talks, and workshops.

This is a picture of the outside -->



Exterior view of Void Gallery. We are located at 10 Waterloo Place, Derry, BT48 6BU.

To go into the gallery, I pull open the front door.

I see a wheelchair ramp to my right leading to the front desk and the foyer as I come through the front door. To get to the gallery spaces I walk up the ramp.

On my right there is a reception desk with an attendant. I can ask the attendant if I need help. I can ask for access to the quiet space at the front desk if I need it.

The attendant will say hello and offer me a small booklet with extra information about the artist. This has information like the names of the works, and facts about the artist. I can ask the attendant at the front desk to tell me about the exhibition if I would prefer.

I continue past the front desk and the offices and will see a room where art workshops take place.

I continue past this room to get to the gallery spaces.



View from the Front Door

The first gallery space is the first large space at the end of the corridor. There are high ceilings.

This is Gallery 1. Art that is either painting, sculpture, print, photography, video, performance or/and installation is on display in this room. There may be different types of lights, sounds and smells in this room. This room may be made dark with black out fabric or dark paint.

If the gallery space is too loud or too dark I can ask for ear defenders or a light at the front desk.

In the gallery I must not run. I cannot touch the artworks because they are fragile and easy to damage.

I can continue through Gallery 1 into Gallery 2.

This is Gallery 2. Art that is either painting, sculpture, print, photography, video, performance or/and installation is on display in this room. There may be different types of lights, sounds and smells in this room. This room may be made dark with black out fabric or dark paint.

I can get to the toilet from here.

On the right side of Gallery 2 I can see a sliding door. I open the door by sliding it to the left. I go through this door to visit the toilet.

I see the toilet in the corridor on the right hand side.
